In Art we are studying Vincent Van Gogh's 'Starry Night'. We will work towards creating our own version in his style, using watercolours in our sketch books.

Science

Our Science Topic is 'States of Matter'. So far, we have explored substances and materials which are solids and liquids. Eventually, we will be able to explain the water cycle, which links to our geography topic.

Geography

This term, we will be studying the water cycle, which will support our science lessons where we will be investigating the three states of matter. Our knowledge of the water cycle will then enable us to learn about how clouds are formed so rain can fall. Then, we will investigate the key aspects of flooding and how water pollution is treated.

Maths

Our Maths begins with multiplication and division. We aim to be able to times and divide 2 and 3 digit numbers using a range of methods. It is important to note that we will be having our multiplication tests very soon this year, so please remember to practise with your children!

PE

Our current PE focus is 'transferrable skills'. These are skills which can be applied in the contexts of many different sports such as throwing, catching, body movement and control, teamwork and balance.

Writing

To begin with, we will be reading a book called River Story by Meredith Hooper after which we will be writing our own poems about the exciting, mysterious journey that each river makes. Then, we will be using 'The Water Horse' by Dick King Smith to enable us to develop our letter writing skills.

Reading

This term, we will continue to use Charlotte's Web as the basis for our reading workshop sessions. In order to broaden and deepen our reading skills, we will be learning how to respond and explain, infer by making predictions, clarify different concepts and grow our vocabulary through the use of language for effect.

RE

This term, we will be studying the theme of 'Identity'. In order to do this, we will put this concept into context by learning about the Sikh festival of Baisakhi, which celebrates the founding of the Sikh community, the Khalsa, in 1699. Furthermore, we will look at how the festival is celebrated at this time of year.
