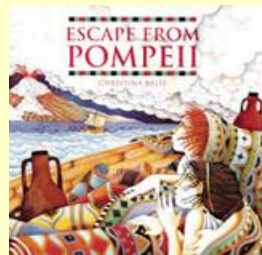
PSHE

Time
