Remember you can always get in touch and let us know how you are doing, we do love to hear from you.

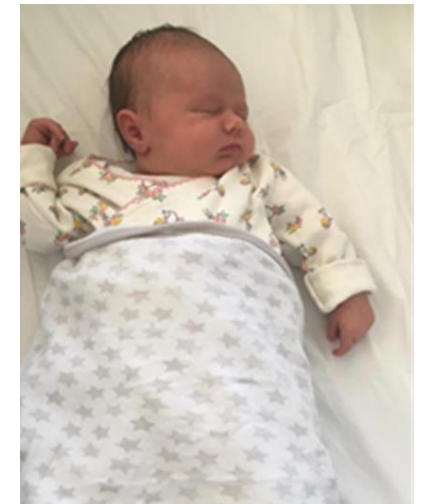
