HOW TO AVOID CATCHING AND SPREADING GERMS

Hands can transfer germs to every surface you touch. Clean your hands as soon as you can.

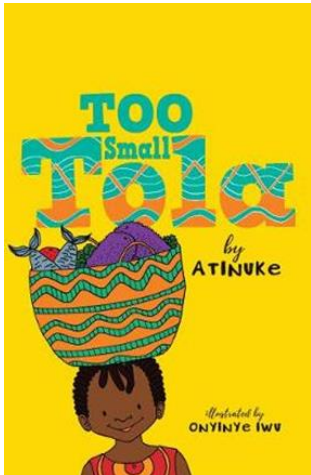


Library News

by Atinuke

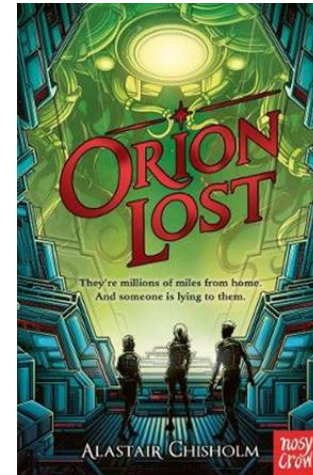
