On Tuesday, Year R enjoyed a local walk to the nearby bridge as part of their local topic study, On Wednesday, Year 3 & 4 enjoyed a Tri-Golf event and today Year 4 have enjoyed their swimming lessons. I'm very proud of all the sporting activities we offer for the children and Mr Smith is in the process of getting the schools Platinum Sports Mark, celebrating the achievements of everything we do. As it stands, very few schools have achieved the Platinum Sport Mark.

Online safety top tips - Online Protection Tools

Online tools let you control your kids' access to adult material and help protect them from Internet predators. Many Internet service providers (ISPs) provide parent-control options. You can also get software that helps block access to sites and restricts personal information from being sent online. Other programs can monitor and track online activity.

Nursery: Owlets: This week they have been learning about doctors and nurses and how they help us.

Owls: The Owls have been developing their scissor skills by snipping different materials to stick down using PVA glue. Outdoors they have explored some new tyre swings and showing their collaboration skills by helping each other to get on and off the tyres as well as pushing their friends.

Reception: This week the children walked to the bridge near the shop to see what different vehicles they could see. On the way they looked at the different plants they could see and were very excited to see a snail hanging on the end of a leaf up in a tree! They also looked at the different 'street furniture' on the way such as lamp posts and the bus stop. Once back at school the children used their phonic knowledge to write a list of the different vehicles they had seen. All the children followed the school values on the trip and were a credit to the school.

Year 1: Year One have started their new text this week, called 'Lion Inside' by Rachel Bright. It's a great story about being confident and realising we all have a lion inside of us! In maths, they have looked at number lines and where numbers go, using the language of more than, less than and equal to, and working out one more and one less than a given number. In RE, they looked at a church as a special place for Christians, and in geography they wrote a postcard home as if they had gone on holiday to Kenya. The sun has been shining so they've been able to spend some time outside too. What a great week Year One!

Year 2: This week the children have been enjoying their new rich text, 'Mary and the Great Fire of London'. They were very relieved that Mary and her mother managed to escape to safety. They then wrote statements and questions about the Great Fire and impressed Mrs Race with their knowledge! In maths the children have been solving fraction problems and drawing bar models to represent the fractions. Our theme in RE this term is Special Books and the children bought in their special books to share. They all really enjoyed listening to each other and finding out why the chosen books were so special.

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Year 3: In year 3, we have been publishing our stories that we wrote last week in English and have been thinking about why we have used the different skills in our writing. In maths, we have started looking at tenths moving on from our learning looking at our place value to help us with multiplying and dividing by 10. We have introduced the decimal point and have been exploring how tenths are 10 times smaller than our ones. In history, we have had a go at making travel brochures linking with our topic of Ancient Egyptians.

Year 4: This week, Year 4 had an exciting kick-off to their new book, the 'Water Horse', when learning about the terrific legend of the Loch Ness Monster. In maths, they have been investigating 2D shapes and their properties. While Warwick class continue their Friday swimming lessons, Windsor continues to explore the art of Claude Monet.

Year 5: Year 5 are very excited about their new English journey 'Wilderness Wars' and our hook - building dens in Forest school. In maths we are revisiting fractions, consolidating everything we already know about comparing, ordering, adding and subtracting fractions and learning to multiply fractions too. In PE we are learning to pace ourselves in running and throw a javelin. In geography we are continuing with our unit on 'maps' and learning how to read 4 and 6 figure grid references.

Year 6: In Year 6 this week, children have been solving multi-step problems that involve the 4 operations. In English, pupils have been completing their survivor narratives, using relative clauses and expanded noun phrases. In PE, learners have been focusing on how to improve their accuracy when bowling in cricket and in RE, students have been learning about why leadership is important to Christians.
