Another lovely week, with lots of fun activities. On Monday, the children were all very excited and positive when they found out about their new classes and Tuesday was Bump up morning. The children got a chance to go into their new classes and meet their new classmates. The morning was a huge success and the children and staff had a great time. On Wednesday, Year 5 had a taster day at Harrow Way which they all enjoyed. Also on Wednesday in the morning Year R showed great resilience in their Sports Day, the children did us proud! On Wednesday and Thursday, Year 6 had fun at Harmony Woods, doing an Archeology dig, which they all really enjoyed. All round, a very busy week!

Now the two schools have federated, we are using this as an opportunity to organise more transitions for the children so they can start September in the best way possible. On Monday 22<sup>nd</sup>, all children will be spending the day in their new class. We hope this extra transition will help with any worries that they still may have.

**Nursery:** Owlets: Blue has been the focus colour in Owlets this week. Outdoors they have enjoyed crawling through the big tunnel. Some of the Owlets that are moving up to Owls in September spent some time playing in their new classroom.

Owls: 'The Enormous Turnip' is the story in Owls this week. The beans that Owls planted are starting to grow really tall and the children have enjoyed making observations of them at snack time including comparing the sizes of the two plants. The Owls that are moving to Reception enjoyed a morning with their new teachers too!

**Reception:** This week the children enjoyed competing in the Reception sports day. During the morning all the children showed the schools values, especially resilience. The staff were all very proud of their efforts. The children all enjoyed an ice pop for snack afterwards too! The children have also been excited this week to see that some of our vegetable plants are now producing vegetables. They have pulled up some carrots and picked some broad beans. They enjoyed feeling the inside of the bean pod once they had taken out the beans. They are now eagerly awaiting the tomatoes to turn red.

**Year 1:** Year 1 have had a busy week with having a morning in Year 2 getting ready to see what Year 2 will be like. In maths they have looked at time problems, days of the week and dates. In English, they have planned and begun writing their own poems about Senses.

**Year 2:** Year 2 enjoyed their morning meeting their new teachers on Tuesday and were eager to share their experience back in class. In English this week the children wrote their sequel stories, 'The Pirate Muncher' and they wrote about amazing adventures looking for lost islands and treasure. In maths Jays have revised using money and have solved more complex problems involving prices and giving change. In science the children are looking at plants and what plants need to not only grow but to grow as healthy plants. Jays have planned and set up an experiment to find out if healthy plants can grow with no water or light.

**Year 3:** In English, this week we have started reading the text 'Charlie and the Chocolate Factory'. The children enjoyed exploring the different inventions that Willy Wonka had made and discussing which ones they would like to try. In maths, we have explored multiplication by introducing the grid method when looking at 2-digit by 1-digit sentences e.g.  $14 \times 5 = 70$ . The children have used great resilience when using their concrete resources to support them with this learning. In science, the children have been learning about the human skeleton and looking at the different names of bones which makes up our skeleton. Why don't you ask them to see if they can remember any of them?

**Year 4:** Year 4 has resumed its English learning journey based on 'The Promise', which will end with a setting description. Maths sees a return to learning how to use money and calculating the total amounts of spending and change given. Finally, science has seen the children learning about how to create a branching database on classifying plants and animals.

**Year 5:** Year 5 have had a very full transition week this week. On Tuesday, we had a great day at 'Bump Up' Day and met our new adults who will support us through Year 6. On Wednesday, we spent a day at Harrow Way to see what life will be like when we join secondary schools next year. On top of this, we have still been doing lots of great learning. We learned about moon phases in science and all about volume in maths having finished our work on measures and doing lots of word problems.

**Year 6:** In Year 6 this week, pupils have enjoyed spending their first full day at secondary school. It has been an exciting experience for all and I know the children are now feeling much more excited and confident about their next step. Back at school, Year 6 have been working on their performance and are now performing their lines without their scripts - we are all eager to perform it to audiences next week! Additionally, Year 6 have been on a trip to Harmony Woods this week, looking at an archaeological dig site and have become historians, searching for primary sources.

### LEARN TO SWIM INTENSIVE SWIMMING COURSES

Places Leisure and Test Valley Borough Council are keen to support more of the Borough's children to learn to swim and to also achieve the national curriculum target of being able to confidently swim 25m by the end of Year 6. Being able to swim is an important life skill and a great way to participate in sport and be physically active.

The Learn to Swim Intensive Swimming Course scheme is a series of daily swimming lessons that take place through a school holiday period and is aimed at school-aged children at beginner level. Places Leisure are pleased to be able to offer several intensive courses at Andover Leisure Centre during the school holidays and would like to offer your child a place. These courses usually cost £43 per person but are being offered to you at the subsidised rate of just **£32.50 per child**. Summer Intensive lessons are available on the below dates and between the below times:
