Dear families,

It has been our first full week back, and the children have continued to grow in confidence day by day. Already, we are seeing the children working hard to show their Knights' Way, the school values. The children's curriculum for this term has been sent out separately and outlines their learning for Autumn 1. Copies can also be found under class pages. We are proud of the curriculum we offer the children and this is evident in the Year 5 residential happening this week. Next week, the children look forward to meeting the fire service, we also have a special guest in school to talk about Railway Safety. These are just a few of the many enrichment experiences we hope to continue to offer the children throughout the year.

Nursery: Owlets: Owlets have had some new friends come to join who have been busy learning the routines and enjoying spending time outside exploring the environment.

Owls: In Owls they have been learning some nursery rhymes and sharing some stories including 'Where's Spot?' and 'That's not my owl'. The children have been exploring the classroom and outside with their new friends.

Reception: The new Robins and Puffins have had a great first full week in school and have been settling in well. We have had so much fun exploring all the areas of our new classroom. We have been drawing self portraits, focusing on our features and where they go. We have started phonics and have been learning our first few sounds s, a, t and p. During funky fingers we have been practicing the correct formation of these letters as well as improving our fine motor skills. It has been a very exciting time and we have all tried very hard to be independent.

Year 1: It has been a super start to Year One! The children have wow-ed us with amazing writing and effort in all of their learning! It's an especially busy timetable and we hope you get a chance to share it with your child from the back of their diaries. We are looking forward to learning about ourselves this half term, using our senses in Science and drawing portraits in Art.

Year 2: What a terrific first week the children have had in year 2! They have so enjoyed meeting up with their friends again after the holidays. In English they thoroughly enjoyed sharing our new rich text, 'Can I Build Another Me?' by Shinsuke Yoshitake. The children wrote about what jobs they would like a robot to do for them. In maths they have revisited their learning in number and place value and have been representing numbers using a selection of different resources. In art they have been introduced to the work of Henry Moore in preparation for still life drawing inspired by his drawings.

Year 3: In Maths, the Year 3 have been working extremely hard to show their understanding with Place Value. This has involved them using concrete resources to make numbers before identifying the value of each digit in a number. In English, the class has been looking at a book called 'Stoneage Boy'. The story focuses on a young boy who falls down a hole and ends up back in the Stone Age! During P.E, the class took part in an Athletics session.



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All of the students were excellent and really enthusiastic to learn from our sports coach. Finally, the class has settled in brilliantly at the Junior school and we are really proud of them all.

Year 4: This week in Maths, Year 4 have been solving problems relating to place value. This has included everyone identify the value of digits in two, three and four digit numbers. In addition, everyone has really enjoyed the start of our new writing journey where we have focused on a text called 'Meet the Romans' which links to our History unit of work. The students have researched some facts about the Romans and looked at the key features in a set of instructions. During the P.E sessions, the class have learnt some gymnastic skills by looking at a variety of balances and ways to travel around equipment. Also, we took part in an athletic session which focused on running and improving our running ability.

Year 5: Year 5 have kicked off their week with learning all about gruesome fairy tale villains. Using exciting adjectives, Year 5 wrote a retelling of the story 'The 7 Little Goats' from the perspective of the Big Bad Wolf. Art shares links to their history topic 'Crime and Punishment'; Year 5 have enjoyed learning about the anonymous graffiti artist Banksy and tried to re-draw some of his more recent artwork. Some of Year 5 have enjoyed a residential trip to Grittleton, the children who stayed at school had an amazing time in school making pancakes and pizza and we also did some amazing bubble art. Fun was had by all.

Year 6: In Year 6 this week, pupils have been learning all about place value in numbers with up to 8-digits. In English, learners are reading Viking myths and are starting to think about their own ideas when creating their own stories. In PSHE, students are focusing on friendships with others and have had to focus on communication with their peers when building bridges. In Music, Year 6 currently have Listen 2 Me and have enjoyed playing their ukeleles this week.
