We've had a lovely week at school, with the children settling in well and engaging enthusiastically with their new theme. Curriculum overviews will be sent out today, providing an outline of what the children will be learning this term.

### Beavers/Cubs/Scouts – Taster Sessions

The local Beavers, Cubs & Scouts club run from our school now in the evenings.

They are planning some taster sessions on the following dates:

- Beavers (age 6-8): 6pm to 7pm on Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> June
- Scouts (age 10-14, siblings welcome): 7pm to 8pm Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> June

This will be a drop in session with some activities with information about the group and how to volunteer.

### Online Safety – This week's focus is: Cyberbullying

Cyberbullying is bullying that takes place using technology. Whether on social media sites, through a mobile phone, or gaming sites, the effects can be devastating for the young person involved. There are ways to help prevent a child from being cyberbullied and to help them cope and stop the bullying if it does happen. Parents and carers need to be aware that most children have been involved in cyberbullying in some way, either as a victim, perpetrator, or bystander. By its very nature, cyberbullying tends to involve a number of online bystanders and can quickly spiral out of control.

**Nursery: Owlets:** Owlets have been exploring the gloom and talking about what they can see and feel. While getting ready for outside they have been talking about keeping safe in the sun by wearing hats.

**Owls:** Handa's Surprise has been the text that has inspired lots of discovery in Owls this week, including having different African animals in the sand tray and naming the animals from the story. Puzzles have been very popular with the children where they have been developing their collaboration skills.

**Year R:** This week, Reception has had so much fun during their learning. Our story over the next two weeks is 'Handa's Surprise', where we see lots of cheeky animals taking different exotic fruits! Keeping with the theme of fruits and animals, we have been making fruit animals with cocktail sticks! We were able to put our cutting skills to the test and try lots of different fruits, they were delicious. In maths we are looking at numbers beyond 20, how we make them and what they look like on a number line. The children have been working very hard and making sure to be independent. It has been a fantastic and sunny week for all the children. Well done Robins and Puffins!

**Year 1:** Year One have worked really hard this week to learn some new spelling and grammar techniques with their writing, especially remembering to add -ing to the end of present tense verbs. In Maths, they've been continuing to count in 2s, 5s and 10s, and then practised sharing by creating groups. In Science, they are recapping body parts this week, labelling what each part of their body is called. In PSHE they are talking about how to eat healthily - can the year ones challenge themselves to eat a fruit or vegetable they've never tried before?

**Year 2:** This week in maths the children have been learning to solve simple addition and subtraction problems in the context of money. They have been 'buying' two items and working out how much to pay and also working out the change they would expect when they don't have the correct coins. In English the children have been using adverbs to make their writing more interesting. They have been considering what they know about a text and the illustrations in the text, to infer what is happening in the story. In DT the children have begun to design their own dragon heads and they will make these using hinges and levers to create an opening mouth. We are looking forward to seeing some very fierce dragons in year 2!

**Year 3:** In English, we have been doing some drama this week and creating freeze frames of different parts of the text. The children were very creative and using their bodies in interesting ways to create the different pictures. In Maths, we have done lots of learning around our 8 times table looking at multiplication and division. In PE, this week, with Personal Best, the children played a small game of Quick Cricket. I was very impressed by the batting that happened and how far the children were hitting the ball. Good job Dover!

**Year 4:** In English, the students have been identifying key vocabulary in our new text 'a river story'. This has then involved them try to 'uplevel' their vocabulary ready to write their own poems. During Maths, the classes have been looking at multiplication. This has involved them using a pictorial and formal method. They are all growing in confidence with this. In French, the students were learning how to tell the time. This involved them verbalising and writing the time to the nearest hour. In addition, in Geography, the classes have been looking at the 'water cycle'. This involved linking the ideas to their science lesson by understanding evaporation and condensation.

**Year 5:** Year 5 have been looking at how living things are classified in Science and learning about the key features of different vertebrates. In English the children are evaluating acrostic poems; looking at language features and vocabulary choices. In maths, they have been revisiting short multiplication before moving onto long multiplication. They children have enjoyed their PE sessions with a teacher from Harrow Way and Personal Best.

**Year 6:** In Year 6 this week, students have enjoyed preparing for their Reading Assemblies. In Arundel, they will be sharing a variety of funny stories. Balmoral will be sharing nonsense poetry shortly after. In English, learners have been re-capping their knowledge of simple, compound and complex sentences and in Maths, have been learning about place value and ratio. In grammar, pupils have been re-capping word classes and in Reading Workshop, children have been exploring a variety of question types to improve their understanding of the text.
