**Year R:** Welcome back Robins and Puffins for our final half term! It has been a wonderful week with everyone back. This week we have been looking at our new story, 'Jack and the Beanstalk'. All of the children have been enjoying doing the giants voice with 'Fe Fi Fo Fum!'. We all love to explore the small world and re-enact the story using figures and our own imagination. In maths we are looking at grouping and sharing different objects, making sure that each group is equal in value. Finally, a very big well done to Robins and Puffins, on Wednesday we had a visit from BrightBites and all of the children sat and listened well, engaged and asked lots of questions. Well done Reception!

**Year 1:** Year One had an amazing day out to Marwell Zoo, seeing giraffe, zebra, tigers, meerkats, monkeys and many other animals. The zookeeper inside the giraffe house told Mrs MacGinnis we were the best behaved school group to come through all day. We are so proud of the respect and nurture they showed to all throughout the day. Well done Year One! Now on with our new topic which is the Great Fire of London, starting on Monday!

**Year 2:** We have had a super week this week. The week started with our 'Knights' Way Day' when the children had many different exciting tasks to complete showcasing the five school values including writing a message in a bottle for next year's year 2 children and solving some fun maths challenges. The children enjoyed an interesting presentation by Brightbites when we learned about the importance of looking after our teeth, although we do understand that our first teeth are meant to fall out during year 2! In English the children worked collaboratively to create their own treasure maps. They then really enjoyed their new rich text, 'The Pirate Cruncher' by Jonny Duddle and they have already identified some lovely pirate language ready for their writing. In maths the children have explored the properties of 3D shapes practically, in order to sort them according to different criteria and have applied their subtraction skills to solve more complex problems.

**Year 3:** In English, we have started to look at poetry. We have read the poem 'Come all you little persons'. In our hook lesson, we made capes made from bin liners to represent the different little persons in the poem. In Maths, we have been recapping our learning about capacity and volume. The children enjoyed walking round the room exploring different containers and using their mathematical language to describe them. In geography, we have started our final unit of work around a local study. This week, we looked what countries make up the United Kingdom and Great Britain and named the capital cities of each country.


**Year 4:** On Tuesday, the class enjoyed their collaboration day. This involved them all taking part in teamwork tasks and tested their communication skills. In English, the students focused on persuasive and emotive language which they will then use in their writing outcome next week. To do this, the students used pictures from the book 'Water horse' to write using imperative verbs. In Maths, the students have focused on their 11- and 12-times tables this week. All of the classes have noticed a real improvement in their knowledge and understanding of multiplication and division facts. In addition, Year 4 started their new science theme which involved looking at animals and their habitats. To start with, they all looked at what features were in all living things. For example, all living things reproduce, move and grow. All of Year 4 are looking forward to the summer fair and they hope to many of you there.

**Year 5:** Year 5 had a great first day back with lots of Knights way Values Day activities around the value of collaboration. The children started the day thinking about what collaboration means and the skills needed to collaborate effectively. The children took turns to be a designer, an organiser and a builder to give instructions on how to create a certain structure using multilink and completed a variety of tasks working together. The children have started their new learning journey on the theme of space which will be our science and English focus for this half term.

**Year 6:** In Year 6 this week, students received a letter from Mr Whitehouse explaining that he was going to get rid of Toffee. The children were noticeably disgruntled about this and in English, wrote a letter back to Mr Whitehouse persuading him to keep her. Additionally, children have been working hard learning their lines for the school production. All pupils have impressed us with how they are thriving and I know they will enjoy rehearsing on the stage next week.

This will be a drop-in session with some activities with information about the group and how to volunteer.

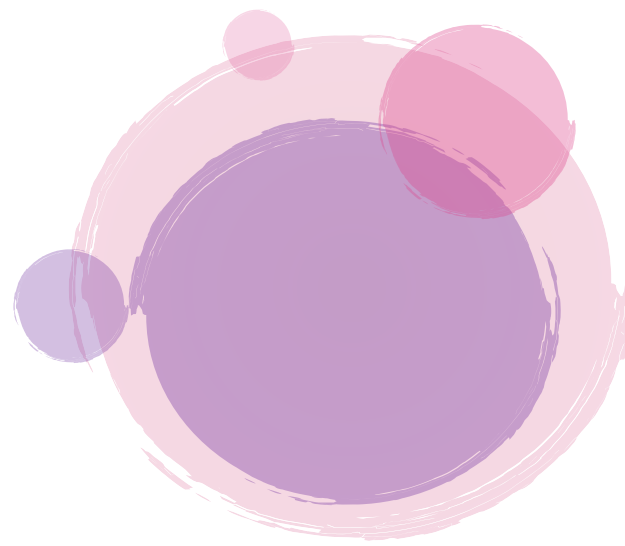
## **PTA**
