

Anti- Bullying

In Year 3, Anti-Bullying education helps children **understand what bullying is, recognise how it makes people feel, and know how to respond safely.** Teaching focuses on **preventing bullying through kindness, respect, and speaking out,** while giving pupils the confidence to **seek adult help** when needed. Anti-Bullying is taught through:

- PSHE (Relationships Education)
- Whole-school safeguarding
- School behaviour and anti-bullying policies

Keeping Safe

In Year 3, the Keeping Safe curriculum helps children **recognise risk, understand boundaries, and know how to protect themselves** in everyday situations.

A strong emphasis is placed on **adult support, clear rules, and speaking up when worried.** Teaching is **age-appropriate, non-frightening, and preventative,** empowering pupils to feel safe at school, at home, and in the wider community.

E-Safety

In Computing, we learn how to keep safe, including: playing games and we refresh this at the beginning of every Computing learning journey. E-safety is also discussed in detail on internet safety day and during assemblies.

In Upper Phase, they have Cyber Ambassadors who run activities to help keep children safe online.

Awareness of other cultures

In Year 3, cultural awareness is not taught as a single subject. Instead, it is **woven across several curriculum areas,** helping children to understand and respect people, traditions, and ways of life beyond their own

By Year 3, pupils are expected to:

- Understand that people live in different ways around the world
- Show **respect and curiosity** about similarities and differences
- Develop **tolerance and empathy** toward others
- Begin to see themselves as part of a wider global community



Year 3

British Values

In Year 3, British Values are taught to help children:

- Understand how society works
- Learn to treat others fairly and respectfully
- Feel safe, included, and listened to
- Develop positive attitudes towards others

This is delivered through PSHE lessons and whole school assemblies.

Relationships

In Year 3, Relationships Education focuses on **healthy, positive relationships** that are age-appropriate and non-sexual. Lessons help pupils understand **how to behave kindly, how to maintain friendships, and how to feel safe and respected** at home, in school, and in the wider community.

Road Safety

In Year 3, road safety education helps pupils recognise danger near roads and understand how to keep themselves safe as pedestrians. Children are encouraged to follow rules, make careful choices, and seek adult support when near traffic

Specifically, our School JRSOs support this through assemblies and competitions to raise awareness.

Health and wellbeing

In Year 3, Health and Wellbeing education focuses on helping children understand how to care for their bodies, minds, and emotions, while learning how to stay safe and ask for help. Lessons promote healthy habits, emotional awareness, and resilience in a reassuring and age-appropriate way.
