Be open with your child about interacting with players online that they only know in the game

Explain to your child that if they should talk to a trusted adult immediately if an online friend asks them: for too much personal information; pictures or videos of themselves or to go on a livestream for them; to move the conversation to another channel, like Whatsapp; or to meet up in person. If your child tells you about communication like this, you can report that player in the game and to [CEOP](#) (Child Exploitation and Online Protection).

Make use of Fortnite's parental controls

Fortnite's parental controls allow you to: filter swear words in text chat, disable friend requests and turn off voice or text chat; set a password for making in-game purchases; and turn on Playtime Reporting for the game, which will email you weekly play reports. 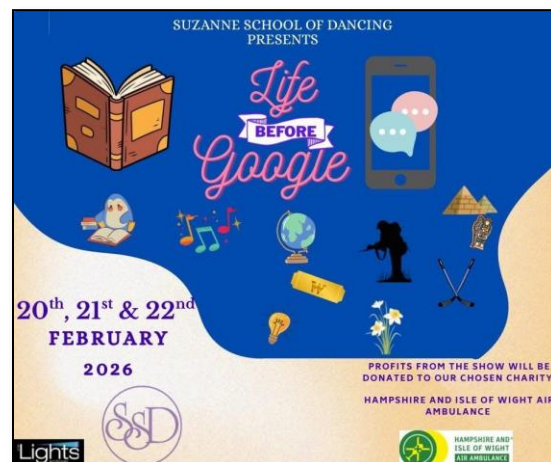
